General Information

- JFM sees the significant investment of volunteers' time and expertise as its greatest asset
- Expenses incurred by JFM volunteers have often gone unclaimed
- The remaining bank account balance of €1,319 will be used to maintain JFM's website and ensure that the transitional justice part of our objectives is carried out
- The category of "Travel, subsistence and care" includes "survivor care" – e.g. covering travel expenses for those who need it.

Bank Accounts

- For the purpose of accountability and transparency, JFM operates one current account with **Bank of Ireland** in Bailieborough, Co. Cavan. **Account No: 32957384**
- All funds received are lodged directly into and administered from this account.

Funding

- In May 2012, JFM received a grant from the Ireland Fund of Great Britain amounting to **€8540.75**
- All other funds have come from donations totalling **€4091.25**
- Some donations came directly from JFM volunteers and supporters
- JFM also received assistance from the *Feminist Review* Trust in collecting testimonies for submission to the Inter-Departmental Committee.
- For a small portion of her work over three years on behalf of JFM (in the summer of 2012), Maeve O'Rourke received some limited philanthropic funding from other sources.
- In 2003, JFM received an in-kind donation of 5,000 black-and-white printed post cards paid for by Miramax, the film distribution company for Peter Mullen's *The Magdalene Sisters*, as part of a mail/e-mail campaign demanding political action to provide redress for Magdalene survivors. **No funds have ever been received from Miramax.**
